3 TO 4-DAY SILENT IGNATIAN DIRECTED RETREAT IN PERSON

Visitation Monastery, Mobile, Alabama

THL 575/455 (including SPT 543/443) examines the life and writings of St. John of the Cross, a central figure in the 16th-century Carmelite reform whose mystical theology has shaped Christian spirituality for generations. Through study of his works, the course explores his apophatic mysticism and compares his spiritual vision with that of his fellow reformer, Teresa of Ávila.
